11TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST & Feast of St Bartholomew

“For thy sake we are killed all the day long: we are counted as sheep for the slaughter” (Ps 43:22). For the past several weeks these words have been fulfilled in Iraq and Syria before the eyes of the world, to a reaction that has too often bordered on indifference in our once Christian Western nations. In the land which gave birth to the oldest known civilisations, and in which the Garden of Eden itself was quite possibly located, in the land of our patriarch Abraham, Christians who still speak a language like of Jesus are being forced out of their homes and churches, or even beheaded and crucified. The doctrine of the communion of saints teaches us that all Christians – on earth, in heaven, and in purgatory – are united to each other by a bond of faith and charity. Even as the new martyrs of Iraq and Syria fill up the Church’s treasury of merit by their heroic sacrifices, we too must tighten our bonds of solidarity with them through our prayers, our mortifications and our financial sacrifices for relief efforts. We should also pray for their persecutors so that, in the words of Pope Pius XI, they may be delivered from the “darkness of Islamism”. True faith is the acceptance by our intelligence, supported by grace, of the truth revealed by God. A religion which can spread itself not through the force of its rational arguments but only by the sword by that very fact shows itself to be false. The heroic witness of our persecuted brothers is a wake-up call for all of us from torpor we feel in the small inconveniences we endure in living out our faith. “In the sight of the unwise they seemed to die ... though in the sight of men they suffered torments, their hope is full of immortality” (Wisdom 3:2-4).
